The 37th Annual Golf Outing is fast approaching and will be held **Sunday July 22<sup>nd</sup>** at the beautiful **Cog Hill Golf and Country Club** located in Lemont, Illinois. The first Tee Times will start off at Noon. Something new this year will be the ability to play on any one of the four courses. Courses 1 and 3 will be \$125 including dinner, Course 2 will be \$150 including dinner, and Course 4 will be \$200 including dinner. The prices reflect the fee structure we received from Cog Hill, as well as the quality and demand for these golf courses. If you choose to have dinner only, the charge will be \$40. A delicious turkey dinner will be served, along with dessert. A cash bar will be available for your libation needs.

Reservations are on a first come, first paid basis. Please call Chris at the NBGC, 773-463-4161, ext 10. Visa/Mastercard are accepted.

## THE COURSES

Interesting layouts and well-conditioned courses have lured golfers to Cog Hill for over 70 years. With four regulation courses, Cog Hill tests players at all levels. Courses #1 and #3 tend to be gently rolling, wooded with mostly elevated greens. They range from very tight to fairly open. There is also a blend of lengths requiring a range of shot making ability. Courses #1 and #3 have enough sand, woods and water to test the accomplished player, but not punish the beginner.

Course #2 (Ravines) is a very sporty, championship caliber course. Three new holes, a par 3, par 4 and par 5, were constructed for the U.S. Amateur Championship, and when substituted for the usual par 3, 4 and 5, are known as the tournament setting. They also permit a hole to be rotated in and out for construction or repair. Course #2 is every bit a championship course with tree-lined fairways, ravines, water, sand and testing greens.

Course #4 (Dubsdread) has been ranked nationally since it opened in 1964. It is known not only for its demands on shot making, but for its vast displays of natural beauty. Tight landing areas combined with heavily bunkered, large, undulating greens make the course a test for the best. It is here that the Western Open has been played. The PGA Tour will be back on this course in 2007 for the BMW Championship, which is a playoff tournament for the new Fed EX Cup.

## FIRST BOB TURCO OPEN A SUCCESS

**Bob Turco** may be calling it the "1<sup>st</sup> Annual Alumni Open Table Tennis Tournament", but we will always know it as the "**Bob Turco Open**" in honor of the former staff member who made games room activities a huge success in our Clubhouse from the mid 1960's to the 1970's. Former Leader **Rick Meidel** thought he found himself in a time warp when he came into the Clubhouse to find Bob Turco sitting over the tournament sheets, signing up players and seeding the brackets. Wonderful memories of the many tournaments at the Clubhouse came rushing back. Bob couldn't believe the "*Wild Renegade*" had actually come prepared to play.

A field of 32 was sought for the alumni table tennis tournament. It was an idea hatched at last year's Family Fest when Bob offered to run such a tournament if there was an interest. "Are you kidding?", we exclaimed. "This is a great idea!" It harkened back to the days when dreaming up games room activities was a way of life for us as Leaders & Staff, and Bob's Table Tennis tournaments could easily turn into an all day, pack your lunch and come to the Clubhouse event.

By tournament time the field was set and featured players not only from Bob's time on the staff, but also era's before and after. **Paul Goerner Sr.** (1940's) showed off a wicked back hand before losing his opening match. Paul went on to eliminate **John Flatley** and **Rich Paschall** from the event. **Scott Goerner** ('80s) also found out that some of those old guys were pretty good after all, losing quickly to former Cougar, **John McIntyre** ('60s) and former staff member **Joe Miceli**.

Current staff member **Phil Jensen** may have thought that his youth would give him an advantage against this field, especially after sending former Leader **Tom Krier** to the losers' bracket in his opening match, but eventual 3<sup>rd</sup> place winner **Ken Naumiec** quickly sent Phil to the losers' bracket. Then Phil beat **Paul Flatley** ('70's) before losing to Board President **Mike Brundidge**. Another representative from the 1980's, **Coleman Conneely**, may have also thought these old guys would be "easy pickins", especially after beating former Leader **Glenn Stahl** in his first match, but **Andy Johnson** sent him to his first defeat. After picking up another victory, former staff member and long time Chairman of the Family Fest, **Jim Kartheiser**, eliminated Coleman. Later, Glenn and former teammate **Mark Payne** admitted that they were trying to help keep the tournament moving so all could get to the after party at **Windy City Inn**.

Staff member **Bill Abplanalp** (Hornets, '60's) looked ready to play by quickly defeating **Steve Loosevelt** and **Arp Horvath** before running into the buzz saw of eventual winner **Andy Johnson**. Bill was then eliminated by **Brian Meidel**, who also played deep into the tournament. Revere Park supervisor **Greg Czajkowski** was spotted brushing up his skills in the games room in the weeks prior to the tournament and picked up victories against Brian Meidel, **Mark Flatley** and **Tom VanDenBosch** before Andy Johnson sent him to his first loss. Greg went on to defeat Jim Kartheiser, 4<sup>th</sup> place winner **Wally Johnson** and 3<sup>rd</sup> place finisher Ken Naumiec before earning a rematch with former Leader and a winner of many clubhouse tournaments, Andy Johnson. All other tables were pushed aside as Andy and Greg would need a lot of room for the final demonstration of their table tennis skills. In the end, Andy prevailed and was presented the 1<sup>st</sup> place trophy engraved with "Bob Turco Open" by Bob Turco himself. After all the awards were presented, and souvenir ping pong balls with the NBGC logo on them were picked up, the players were invited to Windy City for the 'after party.'

A highlight of the tournament on Saturday afternoon, March 10<sup>th</sup>, was the appearance of visitors including present and former staff members. **Rich Brandon** and **Dr. Dan Rubschlager** were on hand to watch "the boys" play and **Mrs. Pat Bradley** came by to take pictures and went on to "chaperone" the party.

From the entry fees the Club was able to purchase \$600.00 in table tennis equipment for the games room. Additional money, after tournament expenses, was donated to the Club by the Alumni Association. Arpad Horvath provided refreshments to the players and surprised everyone by taking pictures, loading them into his laptop and burning a disk of pictures for all those present. Additional pictures are in Rich Paschall's Kodak gallery and if you did not get an email notice, let us know so you can get them as well. Bill Abplanalp went in with his brother, **Tom Abplanalp**, who arranged for a gross of ping pong balls with the NBGC logo that not only went home with many of the participants, but also will be used around the Club for a long time to come. **John Manning** of "Windy City Inn" again showed his generosity to the Club with the exceptional deal he made us for the party room and refreshments. Thanks also to Club Leaders and Staff for setting up the games room, and to current Leader **Aldin Nusinovic** for taking pictures of our motley crew. Of course, our biggest thanks go to Bob Turco for the hours of work setting up and running the tournament.

An evening of memories followed at Windy City and many ideas came flowing forth for more great Alumni events. While Paul Bunyon events seemed like a good idea at the time, upon further reflection the Alumni Association will have to mull that one over. The Bob Turco Open, however, is sure to be on the calendar for next year.

Joe Prybell signed up for the tournament but was unable to attend and donated his entry fee to the cause making 32 players in the field.
