BABY LEAGUE MOVES UP

A new deal for the boys in the Baby League starts next week. They will join the boys from their Team Center who are in the Prep and Prepper Leagues for their meeting.

This is a big event for the boys as it marks the end of their Baby League days. Until after softball their games will continue to be scheduled as Baby League games. After that they will join the Prep and Prepper League boys in a new League to be known as the Tribe League. Congratulations and good luck on your moving up to a higher league.

THE TEAM CENTER TRIBE LEAGUE

One of the most famous tribes of the American Indians was the Wolverines. Their fame as hunters and warriors was known all over the country. The Wolverines were a big tribe. They did not live together in one place but lived in separate villages along the shores of lakes and the banks of rivers. There was great rivalry between the men and the boys of the different villages. Since they were friendly they did not fight each other but played games, performed feats of bravery and demonstrated their skill to see who was best. Contests were held to find out who were the best hunters, trackers and swimmers, who could shoot the longest arrow and who the most accurate one was. Some men were strong, some were swift and others were cunning and skilled. They played games, not the kind you do, for they had their own idea of games.

The Wolverine Tribe wasn't really any different than your Team Center. The Indians lived in different villages just like you live on different streets. The men from a village competed with the men from other villages. Your crews are like the men from the same village. Sometimes two or three villages joined together to get enough men to play some of the bigger games or to do some of the Indian dances. A football or baseball team is formed by two or three crews joining together to form the team.

The Tribe League is made up of the teams from the same Team Center. Little League is an example of what the Tribe League will be like. Last year there were three Little Leagues; each league had its own teams that played each other. Now each Team Center will have its own Tribe League for boys who are eleven years old or younger. They will play baseball, basketball, and football. They will also take over the Little League. This summer the Little League teams and the Tribe League teams will be the same.

Build up your crews to six men who come to meetings regularly; in that way you will be helping your team. To have a good team you need strong crews. The better the teams are the more fun you will have in your games.

DON'TS CONTINUED: Don't follow because the other fellow started across a street. He might make it and you might not. **BE CAREFUL;** do your own deciding and cross only when YOU are sure it is safe.

HOW TO BECOME A BRAVE

The Indian boy had to earn many of the privileges longed for just as the boys living in the city today. He wasn't permitted to wander aimlessly in the forest, to take a canoe out on a lake by himself. Before he was allowed to do these things as well as many others he had to prove his skill and show that he was worthy of the tribe's trust.

To prove his worth every boy had to take many tests. Later on we will learn what some of these tests were so that you can compare them with the kind you take.

Every boy in the N.B.C. Tribe league must pass to become a BRAVE — until he has passed the test he is just a BERRY PICKER.

REQUIREMENTS TO BECOME A BRAVE

1. Know the Tribe Promise and Law and be able to explain their meanings. **THE PROMISE:** On my honor I promise — To do my duty to God and my country — To play fair and square, and To live up to the Tribe Law.
2. The Tribe Law: A Brave gives into his chief. A Brave does not give in to himself.
3. Know what the following are: Team Center, Team and Crew. Also the salute, the signal for silence and the Grand Howl. The Tribe ranks; Berry Picker, Brave, One Arrow award, Two Arrow award and the Chief award.
4. Know the Important traffic Rules: **STOP** before crossing any street and look both ways.
 - a. Cross streets at street crossings only; it is safer to cross where there are **TRAFFIC LIGHTS**.**SOME DON'TS:** Don't run across a street; don't step out between parked cars without looking both ways and being very careful. Don't dodge back and forth if caught in traffic. Stand perfectly still in the middle of the street. The driver will miss you. Don't cross in the middle of the street block. Drivers don't expect people to be there. (con'td. on bottom of first column.)
