THE "HEAVY" RULE
There seened to be some confusion on the heavy and heavyback rules which the Forum decided to clarify at their last meeting Anytime a heavy io running with the ball the play is stopped by two hand tag below the waist. The exception to this is the "heavyback" play.
A heavy may be called back to kick, pass or hand off the ball, however he must be at least five yards behind the line of scrimmage when the ball is snapped. If it is a fake he is out of the play. The heavyback must be tackled, but once he runs past the line, the play is stopped by two hand tag below the waist. Tackiing a runner tho should be stopped by tag is a 15 yard penalty. Other violations of the heavyback rule is 5 yard penalty administered by the "All but one" enforcement principle.
