BASEBALL RULES YOU SHOULD KNOW

1. A regulation game consists of 6 innings.

Shoes with metal spikes are illegal.
 The strike zone extends from the

batter's armpits to the tops of his knees when he assumes his normal batting stance. The strike zone is , judged in relation to where the ball passes the plate, and for where the batter is standing. /
4. A balk is an illegal act by the

pitcher when there is a man on base.

The penalty for a balk is a free base for every runner. The count to the batter remains the same. If there are no base runners, there can be no balks.

19. All rules are in accordance with the Little League Official Rules, except for the few special NBC Rules.

20. Players who do not attend at least 75% of their team's games and meeting

SPECIAL PREP RULES

1. Players bat in a continuous order and
play the field every other inning rules according to the field.

8. All hatters and runners must wear a protective helmst at all times!

9. A player must have control of the ball and a voluntary release in order for a legal catch to be established.

10. A player cannot throw his hat or mitt at any batted or thrown ball. He · also may not attempt to catch the ball with any part of his uniform.

11. All active members present must play at least three innings. Subs of the team with the ins enter the game in the bottom of the third, and subs of the team with the outs go in during the top of the fourth.

12. If the fourth inning is not reached 45 minutes before the end of gametime,

all subs will enter the game.

13. The catcher does not have to hold on to the third strike. The batter's out.

14. Pitchers are allowed 5 warm ups at the start of each inning, and each reliever is allowed 5 pitches.

15. Once a pitcher is relieved, he may not pitch again in that game.

16. Bunting foul after two strikes is an out.

17. Forfeit time is 20 minutes after the scheduled game time. At forfeit time, the captain of the team present has the option of accepting the forfeit, or allowing the team 10 more minutes before claiming a forfeit. If a team opts to extend forfeit time, the game will count - win or lose!

18. The six runs per inning rule will be a. not following through with the pitch after starting a pitching motion.
