If you live in an isolated area, in a neighborhood vulnerable to home break ins, or have valuable art or antiques, explore the benefits and cost of an alarm system.

The simplest in-house alarm system sets up a small electrical circuit across door locks and from window to frame. When this current is interrupted by someone opening the door or window, the alarm sounds. More sophisticated systems include sensing devices to set off the alarm siren when an intruder disturbs a field of sound or radar waves. An alarm system can be monitored by a central station which alerts the police. It can include smoke and fire alarms and buttons to signal a medical emergency.

Look for a system that's made to meet high quality and reliability standards. Ask for the company's references before you sign a contract.
