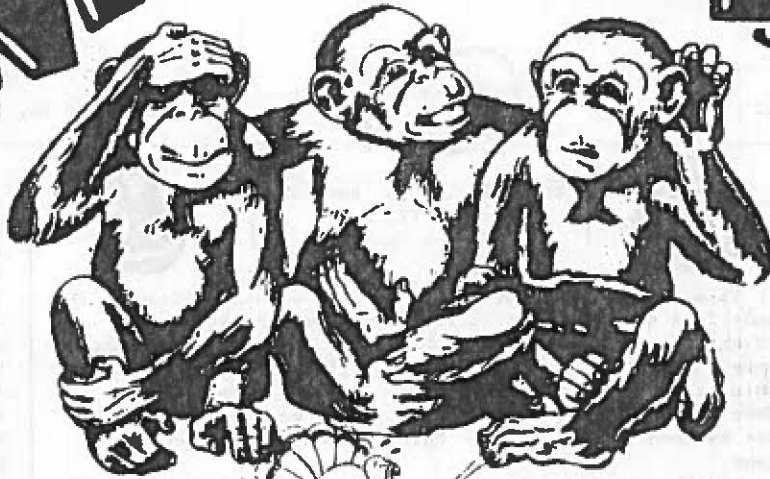

## UNIFORM RETURNS START SATURDAY! FULL REFUNDS GIVEN UNTIL DEC. 5TH

Players must return NBC's football uniform for a refund between SATURDAY, NOV. 28TH AND SATURDAY, DEC. 5TH. As outlined in the uniform letter signed by each parent, the uniform must be returned clean, in good condition, and on time in order to qualify for a full refund or full donation credit.

1. The jersey must be washed clean of mud and dirt with small tears sewn up. Fines are assessed if someone else has to do the work.
2. The helmet must be scrubbed free of dirt and marks inside and outside and the light stripe must be peeled off. Please leave the helmet number on. Do not use a metal scrubbing pad or abrasive cleaner - use a plastic or spongy pad and Soft Scrub. The outside of the helmet must be polished with a floor wax.
3. The chin strap, helmet pads and all clips and screws must be included to avoid fines.
4. Anything damaged or missing must be paid for and will be deducted from your refund.
5. After Dec. 5th there is a \$5.00 fine per week for being late. This fine must be paid in cash! After Dec. 12th the refund/donation is forfeited. Basketball players must have returned the uniform before gametime on Dec. 5th to play that day.

Many of our parents have been very generous and have agreed to donate their refunds to NBC as a part of our yearly Parent Financial Support Program. We ask a \$40.00 donation for one child, \$60.00 for two or more children, to keep the programs running. If you did not check off this option when signing the uniform letter, you may do so at the uniform return.

Joe Gonzalez and Kurt Jentsch are the utility men and are called upon to do a little of everything. The team is coached by Angie and Phil Jensen and Rich Lansu, and the captains are Anthony Oliver and Ben Rodriguez. The Pirates feel that the Bobcats have been their toughest opponents because they are the only team that beat them, and also tied them twice. Excellent attendance and hard work at the practices are the key to why the Pirates have been so dominating this season, and the reason why they are the 1992 champs.

The Bobcat offense relies on a mixture of running and passing. They will use both to try and catch the Pirates offguard. They run their plays out of the double running back set, mainly using heavyback Brandon Feamon at QB. Feamon calls in the plays from the coaches. When the play calls for a run, they use the I formation with running backs Brian Wright, a finesse runner, and power runner Matt Beyer. When called upon to pass, Feamon looks for sure-handed receivers Erik Miller and Rick Lewis. Both have done a great job catching the ball in key situations this season. The Bobcats also possess a huge offensive front line led by Justin Letrich, Wayne Duckmann and Joey Maas. Together they give Feamon time to look for a receiver and create holes for the runners. The Bobcat defense has a great rush up the middle with good containment from the ends. The defense is led by Jon Otto, David Piatkowski, Duckmann and Maas on the line, with Miller and Lewis as ends. Woody Frost, James Kaminski and Feamon are the linebackers. They use good anticipation and power to stop the opposition. The Bobcats are coached by Andy Letrich and Wayne Duckmann and the captains are Brandon Feamon, Justin Letrich and Wayne Duckmann. They feel that the Pirates have been their toughest opponent all season. They were the only team to beat them and the ones who stopped them from the championship. The Bobcat attendance has been the only downside of the season, as it was one factor which prevented them from playing for the title.

The Pirates will go out this morning to prove to the world that they are worthy of being the champs. This is a matchup between two teams which raced out to a fast start this season and enjoyed first place through the first half. The Cougars ran out of gas because they didn't think they needed to keep practicing and squandered an excellent chance. The Locusts tied for the first half title but were beaten in a playoff by the Vikings.

The Cougars have an impressive arsenal of offensive skill. They are led by QB Albert Viktor, who calls most of the plays along with coaches Charlie Otto and Mark Throckmorton. He is a tough runner who goes right over people more often than he runs past them. In the pro-set the Cougars handoff to tough-running C.J. Otto or Tony "Speedy" Iturralde. Their passing defense wasn't bad, but occasionally gave up the big play. The kickoff and punting duties are handled by Vince Iturralde.

The Locusts are the most athletically talented team in the league. Their consecutive sports championships had ended at three. They have streaked through 1992 with titles in floor hockey, basketball and baseball, but fell short of a full-year sweep. The Locusts are coached by Rick Davis and Robert Lamb. They operate out of the T formation. QB Adam Davis runs the offense by handing the ball off to Paul Rohde, Nick Britton or by keeping the ball himself. When the team looks to throw, heavy Paul Aspengren drops back and looks toward his excellent pair of receivers, Matt Myers and Billy Cline. The team was successful on reverses, screens and down-and-out passes. Leading the effort up front were Danny Ball, Julio Ontanon, Joe Rogers, Ivan Rodriguez, Mayco Mata, and Matt Guidara. The kickoffs are shared amongst everyone, but the punting is left up to Paul Aspengren. Julio Ontanon attempted some placekicks for a point. The Locusts also played well as a team on defense. Matt Myers scored a couple of defensive touchdowns. The line up front allowed them to stop the run effectively, and the defense was vulnerable on the offensive line.

## CADET PIRATES VS. BOBCATS

This game features the champion Pirates and the Bobcats. The Pirates finished the regular season undefeated and had to hold off the Bobcats, who made a strong charge in the second half of the season. The onlyblemish on the Pirate record was a tie against the Locusts. The Bobcats are going out to prove that even the champs can be beaten.

The Pirates rely on a strong running game to help break the big play and get their offense started. They like to run out of the wishbone and usually use the sweep to get the job done. The running is usually handled by QB Mike Hernandez and backs Andrew Johnson, Will Locke and Alex Gonzalez. They like to run straight ahead and blow past the defenders. The quick cutting and slashing style of Gonzalez makes him hard to catch. The Pirate offense owes much of its success, however, to the solid blocking of an offensive line by Dan Jensen, Antonio Dintale and Dan Cebollero. When the offense
