

### PREP & TRIBE MEETINGS OCT. 10TH Try The Field Goal Kicking Contest




# VOLLEYBALL FOLLOWS BASKETBALL

### OFFICIAL WEIGHT LIMITS

The Prep, Tribe and Teen weight limits have been set for the regular season. The PREP LIMIT is 72 lbs., the TRIBE LIMIT is 93 lbs. and the TEEN LIMIT is 135 lbs. <u>Only players who weighed in at or below these limits are "lights" and may run past the line with the ball from the backfield and be tackled</u>. Everyone else is a "heavy" and is subject to the restrictions of the Heavyback Rule.

Lights must have a black electrical tape stripe down the middle of the helmet in order to run, as well as a red "L" on each side of te helmet. No other player may have markings on his helmet! Players cannot reweigh, and weight loss or gain during the season does not change a player's status. If a team uses an illegal player as a light it will forfeit all games which involved the illegal player.


### TEEN SEASON UNDERWAY! By: Jeff Janula
