



Oct. 30, 1955 - The Cigar Bowl is cancelled, joining the Refrigerator Bowl, Ice Bowl and Salad Bowl on the list of extinct college bowl games.

Oct. 31, 1983 - George "Papa Bear" Halas, one of the founders of the NFL and owner of the Bears, dies at age 88.

Nov. 1, 1946 - The New York Knicks defeat the Toronto Huskies, 68-66, in the first pro basketball game. The teams play in the Basketball Association of America, forerunner of the NBA.
