

NBGC Leaders are eligible to earn college scholarships under a program initiated by our Alumni Association in 1984. High School Leaders apply each December for \$500 to \$1000 tuition awards, payable upon college registration. College-aged Leaders are eligible for awards ranging from \$1,500 to \$5,000 per year. Long-time service and dedication are required, as well as continued work at NBGC, for the college awards.

Each Leader applies to the Scholarship Committee and is interviewed. The criteria includes their work performance during the prior year and a 250 word essay on their contribution to the Boys Club. The Selection Committee, headed by alumnus James Baumhart, president of the Better Business Bureau, met with the 17 applicants recently and determined the 1999-2000 recipients. Other members of the committee include Tom Boettjer, a past scholarship winner and teacher at Reilly School, and local attorney P. Jerome Jakubeo.

College tuition awards were made to Ricardo Solis, a sophomore at Wright College (\$2,200), William Winters, a freshmen at Wright College (\$2,200), Julie Dakers, a senior at Whitney Young (\$2,000), Charles Otto Jr. (\$2,000) and Gilbert Ruiz, a senior at St. Benedict's (\$2,000). Congratulations to the applicants for their efforts, and to all of the Leaders who applied. The Selection Committee applauds all of the applicants for their dedication, honesty and integrity.


