The Neighborhood Boys \& Girls Club began on a dreary day, in the middie of Paul Revere Park, on October 19, 1931. All that was NBGC on that day was 100 boys who wanted to play football, a football and two referees. The Ghosts and Trojans played to a 13-13 tie and a new organization was born.

The first clubhouse was an old house, belonging to the Forest Preserve District, located on the spot of the current playground. When it was condemned in the mid-1950's, NBGC parents went door to door to help raise the money to build the current clubhouse.

For over 69 years NBGC has thrived as an independent club for boys, and for girfs since 1991, without the benefit of a large donor. This Club is not connected with the Boys and Giris' Clubs of America, and has no single, large funding source. Our money comes from our Family Fest, Spaghetti Dinner, Ham Sale, Directory, alumni donations, parent donations and grants from several foundations and the Chicago Department of Human Services. All of these funds come through the hard work of volunteers who love NBGC for what it has given to them or their children.

How can your family help? One way is to get involved as a volunteer in the Program, with YouthNet or on fundraisers. Another way is with financial support.
