## SCHOLARSHIPLUNCHEON HONORSLEADERS

The NBGC Scholarship Committee, along with the Northcenter and Ravenswood Chambers of Commerce, Ravenswood Community Council and Ravenswood Industrial Council, hosted the seventh annual "Leaders of the Future" Scholarship Luncheon May 5th at Barba Yianni's Grecian Tavema at Lincoln and Lawrence. A crowd of 434 parents, alumni, Board members, former award recipients and business supporters gathered to honor twenty Youth Leaders, including fifteen 2004 college scholarship winners.

The program included an official welcome from NBGC Board President Peter Maxdield, the reading of the NBGC Mission Statement by Amber Jotzat and Ashley Pernau. Our keynote speaker, Chicago Police Superintendent Phil Cline, gave an outstanding speech and applauded the Leaders for their exemplary community senvice. Phil recalled growing up at the Club in the late 1950's and early 1960's, coming to the Club every day, participating in all of the programs and the benefits he received from being a part of the Leader Program. Phil credited the Club for the role it played, giving him the oppotunity to develop the leadership skills which enabled him to rise to the top of the Chicago Police Department.
