# THE RECORD OF THE RAVENS

The Ravens are just one of the teams in the Neighborhood Boys Club. What they did in 1940 is no more than what every team in the N.B.C. had an opportunity of doing. Their record is given, not to show what a good team they are—even though they are a splendid group of boys— but to point out what each and every team could have done. A composite of the 20 boys on the Ravens team taken from the records as of January 1, 1940 reveals that their average member was 12 years old, 4 ft. 11 in. tall, weighed 99 ponds, and was in the 6th grade in school.

The Ravens' total activities, including games, meetings, tournaments, and special activities amounted to 217. The total attendance for these 217 activities was 2,679.

Some of the outstanding feats of the Ravens during 1940 were:

- 1. They won both the winter and summer Team Trip Contests, the highest honor any team can win for good attendance, and special club activities.
- Twelve of their members were winners of Individual Point Awards. Four boys won entrance into the 300 Point League, three were admitted into the Silver Buckle Legion, and five were Junior Point Winners.
- 3. They purchased basketball suits for all their members from the team treasury.
- 4. They were never short of a full lineup at any game, and had an average of 16 boys at each meeting.
- 5. They collected \$39.42 in dues from their members, who paid at the rate of \$.05 per meeting.
- 6. They won the July Picnic Contest, which is based on attendance totals for that month.

All of this above information was taken from the records maintained on every team by the Neighborhood Boys Club.
