The Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club (NBGC), founded in 1931, is a non-profit organization committed to youth development. Our mission is to enhance the well-being and potential of our members, their families, and the community.

For over 90 years, NBGC has continuously pursued excellence in its youth services and organizational governance, driven by the vision of "building better men and women." We are proud of our uninterrupted service to the community, and our board, staff, leaders, and volunteers are unwavering in their dedication to meeting and exceeding the needs of youth and families.

Founded by Robert Buehler and Richard Valentin, NBGC's roots trace back to a single football game played at Revere Park in 1931. What began in a small Chicago garage has grown into a thriving organization that embodies the vision of its visionary founders.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

• How do I register for a program?

• You can register for a program by locating the registration form and informational flyer on the NBGC website at nbgc.org/athletic-programs.

How are teams put together?

• Teams are constructed by considering school, grade, neighborhood, and requests. All requests MUST be included in the registration form. Requests sent via email will not be considered.

• Is financial assistance available?

• Yes, financial assistance is available upon request. If you have previously applied for financial assistance, please take note that a new application must be submitted at the beginning of each program year (each fall). To apply, email finance@nbgc.org **before** registration.

• How do I apply my NBGC Program Credit?

• To redeem your program credit(s), please contact finance@nbgc.org **before** registration.

Where will practices and games take place?

• All NBGC-scheduled games and practices will take place at the NBGC Clubhouse or the Revere Park facilities.

What should my child bring to practices and games?

- Players should come to practices with a labeled water bottle and sneakers. Other gear such as a mouthguard or athletic cup is optional. For games, players should come with the items listed above and their game jerseys.
- In rainy or snowy weather, players should not wear their court shoes outdoors and then inside the gym. Please send players with their court shoes to change into.

What can I expect from an NBGC Clinic, Preseason Practice, or Game?

- Clinics help introduce players to a sport. Clinic sessions run for longer than Preseason
 Practices and have fewer players in each session. Players receive more personalized
 instruction of game skills, strategies, and rules for a sport. Clinics are a great way to make new
 friends and spend time getting better at a sport they enjoy.
- Preseason Practices are held at the beginning of each season. They are scheduled to last for 45 minutes and will begin with dynamic stretching followed by working on fundamental game skills, strategies, and rules.
- Preseason practices are **not** scheduled based on the team a player will be placed on. It is a great opportunity to meet other players in the league that will be playing on other teams. These practices are fully run by NBGC staff. Team coaches don't need to worry about bringing practice plans, materials, or equipment.
- Games are scheduled in 45-60 minute timeslots. Teams will compete against each other while also learning leadership, teamwork, and other NBGC values.
- Each league is scheduled for 2 preseason practices before the games begin.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

• Are there any NBGC-scheduled team practices during the season?

No, the only practices NBGC schedules are the league-wide preseason practices. After the
scheduled preseason practices, any additional practices throughout the season will be coachscheduled team practices. Only pay attention to official NBGC scheduling documents sent by
email and posted on our website as there may be some incongruencies between the
scheduling documents and the calendar in the Sawyer registration system.

• How many games will my player have?

• In a general season, teams are scheduled for 1 preseason game, 6-8 regular season games, 1-2 playoff games, and an all-star game and/or parents vs. kids game. Numbers may vary slightly depending on season length or gym time available.

• Will forfeits be rescheduled?

• No, forfeits will not be rescheduled. Please let NBGC staff know about upcoming forfeits so we can try to find a replacement team for your opponent.

• What happens if I am late/early to drop-off/pick-up?

• If you are early to drop-off, please wait until you are called into the gym. If you are late to pick-up, your child will be brought inside the NBGC clubhouse to wait for their pickup. Please note this may incur childcare charges unless prior arrangements have been made.

Will players be transported to program?

- Players in NBGC's after-school program have the option to be brought to their game by NBGC staff if all of the following situations apply:
 - 1) The player is enrolled in NBGC's after school programs at NBGC Clubhouse, Bateman Elementary, Cleveland Elementary, or Linne Elementary and is present in the program that day.
 - 2) The player has an NBGC-scheduled Preseason Practice or Game with a start time at or before 5:30 PM.
- You must explicitly opt into this service each season during registration if the above conditions apply

What is the cancellation policy?

• If you cancel prior to the start of programming, a Program Credit will be posted to your account. All registration fees are non-refundable. Cancellation requests must be emailed to athletics@nbgc.org and finance@nbgc.org.

• Can I coach?

• If you are interested in volunteering as a coach, please indicate so on your registration form. Coaches will be asked to fill out a volunteer application and will be subject to a background check if they have not already done so in the past 12 months.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

• Season Information/layout:

• NBGC Seasons are broken into 2 phases or sections:

Preseason Practices

- The season will start with 2 preseason practices spread out over 1-2 weeks.
- After the last preseason practice, we move into the game portion of the season. there are no more NBGC scheduled practices after the preseason practices
- Be sure to check your league's specific preseason practice dates in the season's Athletic Guide and nbgc.org

League Games

- Teams start the season with 1-2 preseason games that do not count toward the season standings.
- Each team will play 1-2 games per week on their scheduled league days throughout the season.
- Following 6-8 regular season games, teams are scheduled for playoff games (depending on seeding) and special events such as an all-star game and/or parents vs. kids game.

When will my player receive their uniform

• Players typically receive their team uniform at their first game. We may also schedule a uniform pickup day before the season depending on availability.

• When will I see my player's schedules?

- Preseason Practice schedules can be found at the time of registration on <u>nbgc.org</u>.
- Game schedules will be available in the inbox of email addresses provided at registration and on <u>nbgc.org</u> following the conclusion of preseason practices and 3-7 days before the first scheduled game for that league.
- Only pay attention to official NBGC schedule documents sent by email and posted on our website as there may be some incongruencies between the scheduling documents and the calendar in the Sawyer registration system.
