# JUNIOR SOCCER FIELD 1 9:00 AM HURRICANES & PUMAS VS WILDCATS & ANGELS

Ending the 2017 season for soccer will most definitely be a memorable moment for all the girls. Throughout the season the Junior girls have worked hard towards this day—the final day to show off all their skills as an individual, as well as a team. There will be a promising matchup between the **Wildcats** and **Angels** teaming up to go against **Pumas** and **Hurricanes**. The coaches and leaders should be proud for all the work that they have helped the girls accomplish within the last 3 months while they held the practices and coached on the sideline. The girls have learned throughout the season what it takes to be a great teammate, and will demonstrate that as they combine teams. These two sets of combined great teams will faceoff one last time for the season, and you will be able to watch this on **Thanksgiving Day at 9:00 a.m. on Field One.**

With the Wildcats, they personally found most success with a 2-1-1 formation, very similar to their counterpart on Thanksgiving Day of the Angels using a 2-1-1 formation. Both, the Angels and Wildcats, found most success with smart passing and moving around the field, maximizing their control and being able to constantly mark players defensively and being able to get around opponents when necessary. For the Wildcats, Jaslene Chammas executed the midfield position aggressively every game, and consistently had tireless energy, and was able to execute plays for her team. Similarly, on the Angels, Krishelle Orr and Elaine Uriostegui were great at midfield. Krishelle and Elaine understood when they needed to get back and attack on defense, and when to attack the net. Combined with Elaine, Krishelle, and Jaslene, we will be able to see high aggression towards the net, and many shots on goal. Onto the successful strikers during each game, Jocelyn Serment, of the Angels, has an excellent power kick when shooting the ball and has been one of the top scorers, alongside Giselle Orr. Giselle is an assist machine, and constantly sets up passes to be easily scored by her teammates. The Wildcats and Angels will accomplish a lot with the aforementioned and will excel with Kylie O'Brien, of the Wildcats, because of her accurate passing and ability to make strategic shots. For the Wildcats, Mia Markovic and Georgia Gutierrez are a smart force to deal with based on their powerful dribbling and passes during the games. Both the Wildcats and Angels have a strong defense coming from Vangie Lopez and Makayla Argueta. Vangie is the toughest on defense and is never afraid to charge the offender and cut them off to gain possession of the ball. For Makayla, she never gives up and knows exactly where to go and how to protect her goalie at all times. While all the players have improved greatly, here are some players that improved exponentially. Mia Hensler really learned the game and improved her passing and dribbling with sneaky attacks, along with Mia Markovic, who would soon become unstoppable on the field. Kimberly Cuzco became creative with her plays and would improve her midfield plays over the course of the season. Georgia Gutierrez really came out and showed how well she can pull off playing the goalie position. For the Angels, all the girls improved a lot over the season with their skills and knowledge of the sport. For Elaine, this was her first season playing soccer and she picked it up quickly. In Jocelyn's case, she has been a veteran on the field, and was able to help out her teammates whenever they were stuck in a hole. Krishelle and Giselle, these two girls were incredible at any position they were put in—these girls, according to Coach Tanya, built an abundance of confidence. improved a ton by becoming better with her aim when taking shots on the net—and during one game, made a great direct free kick that resulted in a goal. Both the Angels and Wildcats find the Pumas to be their toughest competitor this season—so it will be fun to see them team up to try and overcome the Pumas!

The Hurricanes and Pumas match-up will be one for the books as they attempt to overtake the Wildcats and the Angels. Both teams have the same style of play and formations while on the field, with having the following: one sweeper, one stopper, two midfielders, and a striker. The style of play that both teams find most successful is their counterattack and quick passes. As strikers, they should typically have a strong kick towards the net, or be sneaky with attacking the net, which is what Pia Azzarello and Emily Rue brought to the table every game. Both Pia and Emily are aggressive when they have the ball and are able to bring the ball up the field in a matter of seconds with their sheer amounts of speed. This will work exceptionally well with Sarah Portnoy and Shelby Goss and their agility on the field. Shelby is able to make the transition to offense and carry the ball up the field within a matter of moments—while Sarah is able to make great passes while transitioning. If at any moment the Wildcats and Angels are able to get a breakaway up the field, Maggy Larson and Lara Aral will be ready defensively as the stoppers and if anything were to get past them, Katie Stein and Kelsey Sullvian are excellent sweepers. Brigitte Cueva, of the Hurricanes, has shown agility while playing as goalie during games. The Pumas have dominant midfielders who are highly skilled, these players are: Avra Fox-Raman, Sylvie Graff, Simone Greicius, and Abbie Graff. The aforementioned girls have an abundance of energy, which allows them to be able to hustle across the field. Avra, Sylvie, Simone and Abbie are a force to reckon with when they are in, and can definitely allow the team to get and stay energized. 
